Just as we light a candle each Sunday during Advent, leading up to Christmas, here we extinguish a candle each Sunday, leading up to Easter. Each candle represents a “letting go” of something that is holding us back from living life to the fullest. This morning we let go of wealth.

Please make note of our upcoming observances before and during Holy Week:

- **Saturday, March 24th, 11:30 am: Easter Egg Hunt** / open to community / location at Rec Building weather permitting
- **Sunday, March 25th: Passion/Palm Sunday** / Celebration and Dedication of the Palms
- **Thursday, March 29th: Maundy Thursday Communion Service** / Sacrament of the Lord’s Supper / stripping of the sanctuary with reading of Passion Psalm / extinguishing the last Lenten candle
- **Friday, March 30th, 12:00 noon: Good Friday Service** / Shiloh Presbyterian Church
- **SUNDAY, APRIL 1st: EASTER SUNDAY** / Announcement of the Resurrection / re-lighting of Christ candle / flowering of the cross outside to conclude service

Today is the **Fifth Sunday in Lent** and marks the continuation of our journey to the cross. We are also continuing our **Lenten Discipline Challenge**. The challenge is to place one thing from your closet or your home that you aren't using anymore in the trash bag each day, filling it up with 40 items by the end of Lent. You are then asked to donate these items to one of our local agencies. If you did not receive a bag and instructions last week, they are available in the narthex or from an usher.
