Throughout Lent we will be praying through the Lord's Prayer. PRAYER FOR HOLY WEEK

"A PRAYER ON THE WAY TO JERUSALEM," IAN COWIE

O Living God, age after age the children of dust make their way to holy places to seek you, yet you are closer than hands or feet.

In temples and in churches people make sacrifices and offerings, but what you seek is the love and well-being of your children.

Your Word promises that those whose hands are clean and whose hearts are pure can climb the heavenly hill; but who are we to do that?

On our journey through life our hearts and our hands have become stained and dirtied.

If we have stretched out our hands in greed, or lust, or love of money, *Lord, cleanse us by your mercy.*
