"EASTER PATHS," JOHN RACKLEY

The Resurrection changes everything. It is an invitation to live differently... ... The God of Resurrection brings life from death, hope from despair, new disconnecting paths to explore.

They are paths of transformation – from fear to trust, from the known to the unknown, from disappointment to delight, from stay to go, from blame to forgiveness, from here to infinity and from condemnation to encounter.

The path of tears

Mary weeps.
They are the tears of grief and longing.
Tears respond to what words cannot describe.
They speak of pathways to experience deep within us.

The path of doubt

Thomas, the lonely disciple.
He spoke what others only thought.
He never felt the others were comfortable with that...
...Thomas, the isolated disciple.
He was given a special invitation from Jesus.

The path of disappointment

They have no name. But their struggle with Christ is familiar. He is not what we thought. He has to meet us in another way.

The path of failure

Peter and Jesus met on a beach. Nothing was said about what had happened. Past failings cannot be removed from the record. Redemption was offered – through a tough choice

The path of disorientation

Paul had a faith and he was happy about it. Then came a moment he could not contain. He could no longer see his way ahead. The old would become the birthplace of the new.

So!

God, you are present in the familiar and secure. When we run for cover because we are tired or too anxious to face disappointment or loss, draw us out of fright and uncertainty and stand with us in strength and power.
