GATHERING AS GOD'S PEOPLE

PREPARATION FOR WORSHIP

Welcome to our service of worship. Although we are worshipping in a variety of locations, we still affirm that God is present in our worship, whether in-person or virtually. Our prayer is that all who worship with us this day will truly feel the presence of God in this time. Know that you are loved and we are so glad you are here! Today is a Sunday of joy and laughter. The second Sunday of Easter has been observed as "Holy Humor Sunday" in western churches since the 1200s, and prior to that as "Bright Sunday" by early Greek Christians. The week following Easter has were ones of joy and laughter for centuries as Christians gathered, and partied, in celebration of the resurrection. Early theologians from Augustine to Gregory of Nyssa argued that God played a practical joke on Satan by raising God from the dead, calling it "risus paschalis" (the Easter laugh)
