First of all, let me say thank you to all of you who have made such kind comments about my sermons during this Stewardship Emphasis Season. Stewardship sermons are tricky, because talking about money is

sometimes uncomfortable. But, as I promised in the first sermon in the series, I have not mentioned money - yet! That will change at Stewardship Dedication Sunday on November 5th.

But it still doesn't make the subject comfortable, because it is such a personal issue - what we give to the church. Bethany has been blessed over the years with the generosity of so many people, that has enabled us to maintain a cushion to guard against emergencies and unforeseen circumstances.

In addition, we have been able to maintain a budget that supports our ministries, our benevolences, staff, and dayto-day operations of the church.

Our challenge is to grow our budget, so that we can not only grow our programs and ministries, but also grow our benevolent giving. As I mentioned on the first Sunday of our Stewardship season, the budget percentage in our SERVE Ministry area is 6%. Wouldn't it be great if we could be a tithing church - where we could grow that so that it would reflect 10% of our budget? Something to work for!

Stewardship Dedication Sunday is always a special time in the life of a church - when we bring forward our pledge cards to place on the table - a symbolic and literal expression of our commitment and dedication to our church and its ministry and mission.

Please continue to be in prayer, asking what God is calling you to do to support this ministry.

What a fabulous Sunday we had on October 29th as we baptized dear little Meritt Russell, and welcomed Erick and Salina into the Bethany family. I know you will enjoy getting to know them, as they have so much to offer Bethany. Erick works with his dad (our friend Ben Russell) in his facilities management business, so he knows a lot about a lot of stuff! And Salina is a very accomplished

photographer, and has offered her services when they are needed. As I mentioned on Sunday, Erick was in my youth group when I was at First, Burlington. I married Erick and Salina a few years ago, so it is thrilling that they have chosen Bethany as their church home and where they want to bring their daughter up in the faith.

As we enter this month where the idea of thanksgiving is so prevalent on TV, social media, advertising, and everywhere, we do indeed need to pause and remember all that we have to be thankful for.

We have had a fabulous year of celebration of our 125th anniversary. We have celebrated baptisms and new members. Our worship continues to stretch our minds and hearts. We have engaged in challenging and meaningful Bible and books studies. We have celebrated the seasons of the church year. We have seen our children and youth participate in VBS and Montreat. We have cared for the needs of others.

Advent is always seen as a time of preparation - preparation for the joyous good news of the birth of our Lord. This year we will be embarking on a somewhat different approach to Advent, with this unique series, "Angels Among Us." Here's a little introduction to the series:

The angels that appear in the story of Jesus' birth would have been very comfortable in our world of tweets and hashtags. Their messages were often short and to the point – their favorite line being #DoNotBeAfraid. As we look at the stories of these winged messengers to Zechariah, Mary, Joseph and the Shepherds and their reactions to them, we will contemplate what messages we can offer that will counteract a culture of fear and bring #morehope, #morepeace, #morejoy, and #morelove to the world.

Advent 1 - December 3rd: Luke 1:5-25, 57-80 - Make Ready a People: #morehope

Advent 2 - December 10th: Luke 1:26-56 - Nothing is Impossible: #morepeace

Advent 3 - December 17th: Matthew 1:18-25 - Do Not Be Afraid: #morejoy

Advent 4/Christmas Eve - December 24th: Luke 2:1-20 - This Will Be a Sign: #morelove (NOTE: Christmas Eve is on a Sunday this year. The Sunday morning service will be a special Christmas presentation by our choir, while our 5:00 Christmas Eve Service will be our traditional service of communion and candlelighting.)

Sunday after Christmas - December 31st: Matthew 2:1-23 - Get up and Go: #morelife

Planting Seeds

The following is an excerpt from the book *Putting the Amazing Back in Grace*, by Presbyterian author, Ann Weems.

My father's wheelbarrow was filled with children. Jostled and laughing, we bumped along to the garden, where we were taught to plant. The first thing we learned was to get on our knees.

The man who came to see my father wasn't smiling when he said hello. He and my father sat in the study for more than an hour.

We waited in the wheelbarrow.

True to his promise, our father took us to the garden, where we got on our knees and planted seeds, even though our father said we might be living somewhere else when the flowers bloomed.

My father said there were people in the church who didn't want him to preach about peace and racial equality and higher wages for the poor. These people told my father to stick to the Bible. Uh-oh, my brother said. So I said it too. Uh-oh.

Sometime later the voting began. The Session voted to take the matter to Presbytery.


The Presbytery voted that my father should resign for "the unity of the church." The Synod voted that my father should not resign because he was a righteous man who had preached the gospel of Jesus Christ. The congregation voted "overwhelmingly" that they wanted my father to stay. "Overwhelmingly" meant most, but not all. My father said it was those few that worried him. Contentiousness had been planted, he said, and it was growing like a weed. Uh-oh.

My father resigned because he didn't want to spend his ministry on quarrelsomeness when there were so many matters of justice and mercy in this world, so many people who needed the compassion of the Church.

Besides . . . he was tired of all the voting . . . as though we in the Church could vote people in and out of the Kingdom of God.

My father's wheelbarrow belongs to my brother. He fills it with laughing children and takes off for the garden to teach them how to plant. The first thing they learn is to get on their knees. The harvest belongs to God.




