The beginning of a new year offers an opportunity to not only reflect on the year past, but also the opportunity to ponder what lies ahead in the new year. What will 2018 look like? What new opportunities and

experiences lie in the future? What mistakes will we make? What lessons will we learn? What will our lives look like at the beginning of 2019?

It's only natural to think about these things as the calendar flips from one year to the next. But a year ago, did we have any idea how 2017 would end up? Probably not. As you may know, I have a long history with the Association of Presbyterian Church Educators (APCE). Although I no longer serve in a leadership capacity with APCE, I still look forward to attending the annual conference, this year held in Louisville, KY. The conference is January 31-February 3rd, but I will also be attending another meeting of the General Assembly Committee on Christian Education of which I am a member, January 29-31. The theme of this year's APCE conference is "Deep and Wide -Boundless Hospitality." I look forward to learning new forms of hospitality that can be useful in the church.

I have also had the privilege of attending several NEXT Church Conferences over the past few years from which our Bethany NEXT Work Group was born. This year's conference is being held in Baltimore, February 26-28. I hope to attend this as well, and hope that other members of our Bethany NEXT Group will attend also. There is much that we can all glean as we continue to strive to enhance our mission and ministry here at the fork in the road . . . and beyond!

And so, as we begin our 6th year together, let us hope and pray for several things: let us pray for happiness and good health of our members and friends; let us pray that God will send new members our way and that they may find a welcoming home here; let us pray for faithful stewardship of our resources, and that we will have the financial means to continue and grow our ministries; let us pray for open hearts and open minds to new ways of worshipping together; and let us pray for God's wisdom and guidance in everything that we do.

Honoring our past . . .



On Sunday, January 7th, which is Baptism of the Lord Sunday, we will honor our past as we recognize the gift and legacy of our current Baptismal Font. This beautiful font, built with the loving hands of Joseph Blair Long (Diane Bullis' grandfather), was given in memory of Winfred Bradley Long (Diane's father) by the Young Men's Class in 1946.

Mr. Long also built the communion table, the chairs by the communion table, as well as possibly other furnishings that adorn our sanctuary and church.

The font will remain as a prominent fixture in our sanctuary, as we always remember the covenant that we all have in the Sacrament of Baptism. We remember with gratitude all those who have been baptized from this font, and pray that they all continue to live into the covenant that was affirmed at their baptism.

As we begin a new year, and continue our march forward into the 21st century, we not only honor our past, but we strive to strengthen our future as we continue to innovate and evolve. Over the past year or so, the use of our baptismal font has grown - not only in the joy of the Sacrament of Baptism, but also in the remembering of our baptisms almost every Sunday.

In an effort to emphasize the baptismal covenant, the idea arose to commission the building and addition of a new font and stand - more prominent and larger scale, reflecting our increased emphasis on the covenant that we all received through the baptismal waters.

Building on the experience of the gift of our Advent Candle stand - now two years old - we wanted to have a significant piece that not only matched the Advent Candle stand, but also fit into our sanctuary. Once again we commissioned woodworker and artisan Will Bucher who has crafted the beautiful piece that now adorns our sanctuary. (Will is John and Debbie's son-in-law.)

As we dedicate this new item on January 7th, our prayers are that all who are baptized from this font will be truly blessed. As we reaffirm our Baptismal Covenant on the 7th, we pray that the covenant that we all have been blessed with at the waters of baptism will continue to bless our lives this day and in all the days to come.












The Session met for its regular monthly stated meeting on December 12th. Here are some highlights:

At this writing, there are no specifics yet, but please know that you will be kept informed of progress and opportunities that will be coming your way.
