My sermon this past week (May 24th) was titled "Tying Up Loose Ends," and I began by talking about trying to get everything done before I begin my sabbatical on June 1st.

As I write this on this last week of May, it really is all about tying up loose ends. I will use this space to share some thoughts as my sabbatical quickly approaches.

I guess the starkly unique aspect of this sabbatical is that it will be taken during a pandemic. As I have noted in other correspondence, my plans for my time away have dramatically changed.

As you know, if you have been reading my articles each month updating my plans, originally I had applied for a sizable grant from the Lilly Foundation. The Center for Clergy Renewal annual awards grants to pastors seeking a time of sabbatical. Unfortunately, my application was not approved, so this was the first time my plans had to be altered.

So, I applied for a much smaller grant from the Board of Pensions of the PC(USA), which was awarded. This will give me some funds to use during this time.

I guess one good thing is that if I had gotten the Lilly grant and had planned for extensive travel in the Holy Land and Europe, that would have all had to be canceled anyway. As it stands, Debbie and I had planned a road trip National Park tour, which will undoubtedly need to be postponed.

As to our travel plans, we will be in Montreat at the end of June, and will travel at some point to Minneapolis to visit with Jackie.

There are some who view this time of sabbatical as a vacation. Although it certainly includes times of rest and renewal, there is an expectation of study and exploration of a topic of the pastor's choosing. As I look at the to-do list that I am making, I will be very busy over the next three months.

My topic of interest and what I will be concentrating on is the "digital church." Our current situation

during this pandemic has made this topic even more pertinent.

I will be looking at the theology behind who we are as a church in an ever-increasing digital world. How can the church continue to adapt to this world without watering down its message and mission? How can the church minister to those who may not be as "plugged-in" as others? I will be seeking to answer those and other questions through my reading and study.

On the practical side of the coin, I will be working to improve and expand our digital footprint as a church here at Bethany. I will be giving our website a much-needed overhaul, and will be looking at other alternatives for communicating with you. I will also be looking at the idea of creating a digital bulletin to enhance your worship experience.

As you may or may not know, I serve the presbytery in the temporary role as Communications Director. I will continue to do that work during my sabbatical, and will also be working to re-build and upgrade the presbytery website, which is also much needed!

So, you can see that I will be very busy, and I'm sure the three months will go by very quickly. I am looking forward to this time of exploration, study, rest, and renewal - with a little travel thrown in as well.

I will be forever grateful to Rick Purcell for agreeing to step in and serve Bethany during my absence. Rick is scheduled to work about 20 hours per week, and will concentrate on worship leadership and preaching, pastoral care concerns, and moderating the Session. I am so grateful that the congregation will be served by someone who knows you, and you know him!


I covet your prayers as I enter this time away. I pray that I will return in September rejuvenated and ready to explore new and creative ministries with you.

The transition to a new structure for Salem Presbytery continues, although with some adjustments and changes. The financial challenges of the presbytery have made it necessary to alter the timetable for hiring new staff and to revise the Dream Team's plan for the new structure.

Instead of proceeding to hire three presbyters on the staff, the plans now are to progress to hire a Transitional Administrative Presbyter with an adjusted job description to reflect the new realities that have arisen, with a 3-5 year contract.

Other staff will also be hired over the next few months, including financial, communications, stewardship, and parish engagement pastors.

Continue to pray for our presbytery during this transition.

(rain date - Sunday, June 21st)


