Readers will explore the beloved stories of the birth of Jesus, the boy Jesus conversing with teachers in the temple, the good Samaritan, the prodigal son, the poor widow and her two copper coins, and rich Zacchaeus in a sycamore tree.

DONALD L. GRIGGS is a noted Christian educator, former professor of Christian education at Presbyterian School of Christian Education, trustee of Union Presbyterian Seminary, and author of several books. Among his books are *Teaching Teachers to Teach* and volumes in the Kerygma study series.

PAUL W. WALASKAY is Professor Emeritus of Biblical Studies at Union Presbyterian Seminary. An ordained minister in the American Baptist Church and the United Church of Christ, he has served churches and university campuses in New York and North Carolina.

BETHANY WINTER VIRTUAL BIBLE STUDY

What a unique opportunity we have this January! You are invited to join a study of the **Gospel of Luke** that will be offered via Zoom beginning on **Monday evening, January 11, from 7:00 to 8:15**. Our seven-week study will be led by **Rev. Dr. Donald Griggs**, a retired Presbyterian pastor/ educator living in Livermore, California. In the study we will learn what is unique to Luke's Gospel, what the author intended to communicate about the life and ministry of Jesus Christ, and what Luke's message means for us today. Don Griggs was a professor at Presbyterian School of Christian Education when Rev. Johnson was a student. He has served in many roles as a Christian educator and loves studying and teaching the Bible.

What a treat it will be to explore this rich Gospel with Don Griggs. We are reminded from the title of the book that **WE ARE ALL BEGINNERS** when it comes to biblical knowledge! Our seven-week study will have the following themes:

- Luke Says Hello and Introduces Jesus: A Study of Luke 1:1-2:52
- Jesus Begins His Work: A Study of Luke 3:1-4:44
- Jesus the Healer and Jesus at Work in Galilee: A Study of Luke 5:1-9:50
- Jesus the Teacher and His Journey to Jerusalem: A Study of Luke 9:51-19:27
- Jesus in Jerusalem: A Study of Luke 19:28-22:38
- The Arrest, Trial, and Death of Jesus: A Study of Luke 22:39-23:56
- Resurrection and Ascension: A Study of Luke 24:1-53

Let's begin the new year with something new . . . something different . . . something a little "out of the box" as they say! Join us on the first Sunday of January as I will begin a new Sermon Series: **The Gospel According to Hamilton**.

As we probably are aware, *Hamilton* is a wildly successful Broadway musical written by Lin Manuel Miranda, that garnered sixteen Tony award nominations in 2016. Anyone who has been privileged to see the live performance, either in New York or in traveling companies, or even has seen the show taped for television, can attest to its quality and appeal.

Even if you aren't thrilled with the type of music we see in *Hamilton* we can all appreciate the talent that the cast displays in every number, not to mention the compelling story itself of Alexander Hamilton.

I came upon this idea of this series quite by accident, as I was looking for a graphic for something else online, and came across the graphic above. I was intrigued by the idea and followed the link and was immediately taken in by the themes I found and the challenge that I saw for myself in creating this series. I am really looking forward to seeing where it takes us!

The series will begin on Sunday, January 3rd, and will continue for seven weeks, which will take us to Lent. Here are the dates and themes for the series:

- January 10th The Gospel According to Hamilton: Forgiveness
- January 17th The Gospel According to Hamilton: What Comes Next?
- January 24th The Gospel According to Hamilton: Grace Changes Everything
- January 31st The Gospel According to Hamilton: That Would Be Enough
- February 7th The Gospel According to Hamilton: Take a Break
- February 14th The Gospel According to Hamilton: Who Lives, Who Dies, Who Tells Your Story?

We talk a lot about seeing the message of the Gospel in the world around us. I strongly believe that God speaks to us through art, through music, through everyday events in our lives. God certainly endowed Lin Manuel Miranda with incredible talents in writing this work of art. My prayer is that I will be able to convey some of the themes that can relate to our lives as Christ's followers.

LOOKING BACK AT ZOZO!



So, What Now?



We've spent the last many weeks singing hymns associated with Advent (the Coming of our Lord) and Christmas (the birth of our Lord). Songs like "Come, Thou Long-Expected Jesus" and "O Come, O Come Emmanuel" rolled off our tongues during the four Sundays leading up to Christmas Day. We started hearing actual Christmas music as early as Halloween. Songs like "Joy to the World", "O Come All Ye Faithful" and of course, "Silent Night" were played in stores and over the airways, giving us premature ear-

worms of the sacred and secular pieces associated with an ever-increasingly long season. So, what now?

It might feel like the holiday season is behind us, but we're not quite done with the Christmas season yet. We recognize January 6 as **Epiphany**, a day set aside to commemorate God's revelation to the world through the person of the baby, Jesus Christ. On the Sunday before this day, we typically celebrate the Epiphany story of the visiting Magi (often referred to as the Three Kings or the Three Wise Men) and King Herod's attempt to find and kill this baby born to dethrone him (Matthew 2). *"We Three Kings"* is probably the most recognizable of the Epiphany Hymns. Immediately following Epiphany Sunday is **The Baptism of the Lord**. We celebrate the Epiphany season for several weeks leading up to Ash Wednesday.
