I've always enjoyed this time of year - not only for the profound meaning for our lives of the Lenten and Easter seasons, but also - and much more mundane reason - the

end of the college basketball season and the major league baseball season intersect. There have even been years when the basketball national championship game would be played on a Monday night, and baseball's opening day would be on the next day. For a big college basketball and major league baseball fan like myself, it doesn't get much better than that!

It's easy to see why people like basketball - it's fastpaced, it's exciting to watch, upsets do happen which adds to the excitement - and March Madness certainly lives up to its name each year.

But there are those who just can't understand the allure of baseball. It's slow. It's ponderous. Hours can go by with nothing happening - no action. There's way to much spitting!

All that is true, unless you dig down to the intricacies of the game. I guess I get my love of baseball from my father. He loved the game as well, and it was one thing that we did together. I remember many Saturday afternoons (the only time games were on TV), watching our favorite teams on the "Game of the Week."

Maybe this is a stretch, but could this not be seen as a metaphor for what Jesus has done for us on the cross. All seemed to be lost. Everyone had given up hope. The one who had come to bring victory was

hanging there, beaten, bloodied, humiliated, and giving himself over to his father.

It was the bottom of the ninth, and for those standing there at the foot of the cross, it looked like the game


But wait! There's more to the story. Friday was a stark and difficult reality, but put your rally caps on because Sunday is coming!

The last four newsletters have given you a little introduction to the advance planning that is continuing as I prepare for my anticipated three-month sabbatical, May-July of 2020. The Sabbatical Support Group (Helen Brown, Ron Kimrey, Sandy Russell, and Tracey Troxler) have met several times and we are thrilled that the Grant Proposal and Application is complete and has been submitted! Now the waiting begins. According to the instructions and information, recipients will not be notified until late August. Fingers are firmly crossed!

As a way of further keeping you informed, over the next few months, I will continue to share in this space the responses to one of the narrative questions that is included in the application. So, here's question #3, and the response:

3. Present a thorough narrative description of the pastor's activities and timeline for the renewal program. Include a brief description and a rationale for each of these activities. This section is where you will give the fullest description of your plans and describe how the pieces fit together into a coherent whole. Use the Outline of Renewal Program form to list in sequence the proposed date(s) for each activity and the names of any family members or associates who will attend or travel with the pastor as a part of this program.

The sabbatical will begin with a time of rest, of rejuvenation and reenergizing. I will identify items that I will need to read prior to the trip, including background information for places that we will travel. I will utilize this time also to set up a blog, that I will use to share my experiences with those who may be interested.

The first leg of our adventure will be a long-anticipated trip to the Holy Land. As someone who has been in church life for my whole life, this is truly a "bucket list" item that is long overdue. This tour (probably through Educational Opportunities Tours) would include Galilee, Cana, Nazareth, Megiddo, Caesarea, Jericho, Qumran, Mount of Olives, Jerusalem, Bethlehem, The Old City, and some optional side trips.

At the end of the Holy Land tour, we would fly to Rome, and have three days to explore there. The visit to Rome would include city tours and exploring this unique and beautiful city.

The new adventures continue as we use our Eurail Pass to explore Europe for the next ten days. Beginning in Rome, the plan is to leisurely make our way to Florence, Milan, Zurich, Geneva (important stop for us Protestants!) Paris, and finally, London. In Geneva I would hope to visit the Bossey Ecumenical Institute of the World Council of Churches and make contact with students or faculty to learn about what they are doing in the use of technology in the global church.

We will plan this part of the trip out carefully, to take advantage of important stops along the way, and to have plenty of time to explore this unique part of the world. Each stop along this part of the trip would include local tours, seeing important local sights, and will include a cooking school in Florence, an experience highly recommended by friends!

From London, we would make our way to Durham, England, where I would spend the next week enrolled in the MediaLit Conference at the University of Durham. This will also be a wonderful opportunity to visit family, as my niece, her husband, and son live there. My niece actually teaches at the university.

Following this week, we would make our way through northern England, and on into Scotland. This will give me an opportunity to explore my roots, as one stop I'm hoping to make is Gifford, to find the birthplace of my ancestor, John Witherspoon - a Presbyterian minister and the only minister to sign the Declaration of Independence. (My full name is John Witherspoon Johnson!)

After traveling back to the U.S., I would spend the next week at the Montreat Conference Center in the mountains of North Carolina for a time of personal sabbath. Montreat has long been my "go-to" place for renewal and rest, and is where my soul is filled each time I visit. My participation in the Worship and Music Conference will allow me to worship without any responsibilities, and to renew my soul in this very special place.





Rushmore, and other possible stops along the way, ending up in Minneapolis to spend some time with our daughter and son-in-law.

And finally, back home to rest, recuperate, and prepare to return to my work with the good people of Bethany.












FINAL WORDS FROM THE CROSS

FINANCIAL REPORT - END OF FEBRUARY 2019

Year-to-date Actual Income	\$38,277.90
Year-to-date Actual Expenses	\$27,852.44

YEAR-TO-DATE SURPLUS (DEFICIT) \$10,425.46

SPECIAL NOTE ON ABOVE REPORT:

On first glance, the end-of-February report looks very good, with a \$10,425 surplus. However, looks can be deceiving. Included in the income figure is several thousand dollars of interest income from our interest-bearing accounts. Removing those interest figures, the actual to-date income is \$25,509.80. That would make our year-to-date deficit at \$2,342.64.

We appreciate all who are keeping their pledges current. Our pledge figures are right on target - meaning that compared to our anticipated deficit from adopting a deficit budget, we are actually ahead of the game by almost \$1,500!

Your support of the mission and ministry of Bethany is greatly appreciated. With your continued support we will wipe out the deficit in no time!



NURSERY UPDATE:

For those of you who make use of our nursery on Sunday mornings, you may have been aware that we have been without a paid nursery worker since before Christmas. We had been contracting workers through a company in Jamestown. Due to the problem in getting childcare workers here on Sunday mornings on a consistent basis, we have terminated our relationship with this company.

We are in the process of searching locally for a competent, loving, and caring childcare worker who will be here consistently on Sunday mornings. We appreciate your patience, and apologize for any inconvenience.

We are hoping to have someone on board in the next few weeks. Our Personnel Committee is working!

UPDATE ON PROPERTY SALE:

As you may remember, the congregation voted last fall to approve the sale of the property across Main Street from the church, that previously was our rental property.

Things are progressing slowly but surely on this sale. There were zoning issues, and other hoops to jump through, but we are hoping that everything will be finalized by late May or early June.
