What an amazing month April has been. We began the month with a spectacular celebration of the resurrection on Easter Sunday. And then followed that up the next Sunday with our choir's amazing

presentation of "Gospel Mass," that filled our hearts and our souls.

I have been pleased with the beginnings of our Spring Book Study - looking at Shane Claiborne's "Jesus For President." And then, as I write this, we have a Fifth Sunday @ Bethany coming up to finish the month out. So, April has been busy, full, exhilirating, and yes - for us clergy types - tiring. But worth every ounce of energy and every second of time.

So, what then does May have in store. After the joy of April (and I think spring is actually finally here), how could we possibly top that in May. Well, the good news is that we don't need to top anything. All we need to do is keep moving forward and keep striving to be sincere disciples of Jesus Christ.

But May does have its high points as well. May 13th sees us celebrate Mother's Day - not a religious holiday, but nonetheless important. I invite you to read the special Mother's Day prayer that is on page 7 of this newsletter.

And then, of course there is Pentecost Sunday on May 20th - one of my favorite liturgical observances. For one thing, it's one of the few times I get to wear my red stole! As shared in the article elsewhere, there are many reasons we celebrate Pentecost - the least of which is the beginnings of this thing we call the church. So, remember to wear red on the 20th.

May will not only be a busy and full month for me, work wise, but there will be some personal things going on as well. In addition to a significant commemoration of another trip around the sun, on May 25th I will finally be having surgery on my knee.

As you may be aware, four years ago this June I injured my knee while doing some yard work around the house. The injury was not in the joint, but rather in the guad tendon - the tendon that connects the quad muscle to the patella (knee cap). In the injury, I ruptured that quad

tendon, but not altogether. The doctor said that I got about 2/3 of it! I wish now that I had gone ahead and had the surgery then, but everyone thought that it would just heal on its own with some physical therapy and time. It didn't.

Over the next few years, I had hoped it would improve, but the constant tightness and discomfort never did go away. I went for a second opinion a couple of years ago, but that didn't give me any hope for relief.

Finally, a few weeks ago I went for a third opinion, and was pleased to find that surgery would be a good option and that it should get me back to some semblance of normalcy. The surgery will involve going in and cleaning out scar tissue, and then reattaching the detached tendon back to the patella. I made the mistake of looking up the surgery on YouTube. I won't do that again!

The doctor indicated that I would be on crutches and in a brace for 4-6 weeks, and then have physical therapy for two months or so. I'm not looking forward to that, but I'm very much looking forward to being able to be more active, to get more exercise, and to be able to get around better and be more mobile.

The way it works out, it looks like I will only be out one Sunday (May 27th), but will be preaching from a stool for awhile after that!

So, the summer of 2018 will be an interesting one for me - personally and work-wise. I am looking forward to two interesting sermon series (see page 4), as well as a new Summer Movie Series (see page 5). Mark your calendars for all of these summer events, and let us continue to celebrate the glorious good news of the resurrection each and every Sunday!

I covet your prayers - not only as your pastor - but also as I face this surgery in a few weeks. And pray for Debbie as well. I'm not sure what kind of a patient I'm going to be!

Thanks for your friendship and for the privilege of being your pastor!



Why Do We Celebrate Pentecost?

Pentecost is observed on the fiftieth (pente) day after Easter, and commemorates the so-called birthday of the church as recorded in the second chapter of Acts. Reading the passage we hear how all the people were gathered in one place and suddenly there was a howling wind and tongues of fire descending from the heavens. Even though they were from all different countries and spoke many different languages, they each heard them speaking in their own language. Peter preached a sermon that day, quoting from the prophet Joel:

"In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy. Your young will see visions. Your elders will dream dreams. Even upon my servants, men and women, I will pour out my Spirit in those days, and they will prophesy. I will cause wonders to occur in the heavens above and signs on the earth below, blood and fire and a cloud of smoke. The sun will be changed into darkness, and the moon will be changed into blood, before the great and spectacular day of the Lord comes. And everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."

And so we celebrate Pentecost because it is a gift of God through the Holy Spirit that the church was born that day. We celebrate the presence of the Holy Spirit among us and we wear red to church on that day - May 20th! It is a gift. Let's celebrate!




As we reflect may our own hearts of love extend to all mother's everywhere.

2018 Narrative Budget

At a meeting of the Corporation of Bethany Presbyterian Church of Graham, NC, Inc. following worship on April 29th, the congregation was presented with a Narrative Budget for 2018 - outlining how funds are allocated among the four ministry areas of Worship, Serve, Teach, and Support. Instead of just taking the four areas as outlined in the budget that is presented to the Session each month, parts of the Support area (salaries, insurance, utilities, etc.) were allocated to each area as a percentage of the work or support that is given in that area. Below you will see the pie chart indicating the figures for each area. As always, for those who wish, a detailed line-by-line budget can be obtained in the church office.

This Narrative Budget is part of our continuing effort to be totally transparent in our financial life here at Bethany. As we have indicated before, we do have some challenges for 2018, but we are confident that with your help and support, these challenges can be overcome.
