I am writing this in the afterglow of another meaningful and profound Lenten season and Easter celebration. This is always one of the most meaningful times

of the year for me, and this year was no exception.

I had never really preached on the seven last statements of Christ from the cross. Deciding to do a sermon series on them during Lent was a little daunting at first, but as I got into them, I was enriched from my study and research, and I hope that you all were fed by the worship services that evolved from them.

And then, to be a part of the choir for its presentation of The Seven Last Words of Christ by Theodore Dubois, was another blessing in observing this special season. Many thanks to Chris for putting that all together. I don't know how much I added to the choir, but I enjoyed being a part of it.

Of course, Easter Sunday is always a joyous celebration. Proclaiming the good news of the empty tomb and singing our Easter hymns and hearing the Easter story again brings us a new understanding and new appreciation of what Christ has done for us.

So, yes, it has been a meaningful season, but the calendar says it is May, which means we're even closer to the summer months and all that goes along with that. I want to highlight a couple of things to put on your radar as we head through May and into summer.

First of all, please note on page 3 the notice of the new Sunday school series that I am going to be offering through the summer months. One thing that I heard through Lent from our Wednesday Lenten Lunch Series group was how much they got from studying a passage of scripture, and then having that same passage be what the worship service the following Sunday is based around.

In thinking of that idea, I thought we might try this idea on a little larger scale. Each Sunday morning

beginning on June 2nd, I will be offering a study session based on the passage of scripture from which I will be preaching on that particular Sunday. I will be using the "Feasting on the Word" resources that will help guide us through these studies.

My hope is that with spending a little time studying the passage before worship, that those attending will have a more meaningful worship experience and perhaps get a little more out of the sermon.

We will gather each Sunday (I will be away a few Sundays but we'll figure that out when the time comes!) at 9:45 for refreshments and coffee, and then a time of study and engaging discussion. We will finish up around 10:30 as I will have to get myself ready for worship!

I do not want this to seem as a competition for the Fellowship Class. That class is thriving and we certainly don't want to do anything to change that. But this is just a temporary alternative for something a little different. And I would invite those interested to take advantage of it.

I would also invite those who are not a part of a Sunday school class to take advantage of this opportunity as well. I think it will not only enhance your worship experience, but hopefully will give you a good head start on your week.

As we head into May, one of the highlights for me will be preaching at the installation of Rev. Evan Harrison at Pittsboro Presbyterian Church on May 19th (in the afternoon). What makes this so special is the Evan was a member of my youth group when I served at First Presbyterian in Burlington. As Evan progressed through his middle school and high school years, I could see even then that he had some gifts that were suitable for the ministry. Fortunately, he heard God's call and has served the church faithfully for several years. I am thrilled to have him so nearby and to serve with him as a colleague in Salem Presbytery.

So, May will be a good month. I hope it is for you all as well. As always, it is a privilege to be your pastor.

The last several newsletters have given you a little introduction to the advance planning that is continuing as I prepare for my anticipated three-month sabbatical, May-July of 2020. The Sabbatical Support Group (Helen Brown, Ron Kimrey, Sandy Russell, and Tracey Troxler) have met several times and we are thrilled that the Grant Proposal and Application is complete and has been submitted! Now the waiting begins. According to the instructions and information, recipients will not be notified until late August. Fingers are firmly crossed!

As a way of further keeping you informed, over the next few months, I will continue to share in this space the responses to one of the narrative questions that is included in the application. So, are the next two questions, numbers 4

and 5, and the responses:

4. Provide a statement written by the pastor that describes the intended benefits, both for the pastor and for the congregation, of the program as planned.

The time away on this sabbatical will provide for me a clearer perspective to better appreciate the opportunities of ministry in the coming years, with renewed creativity and energized enthusiasm. The timing of the sabbatical will provide me a much-needed time of rest after 41 years of ministry, and will give the congregation a time to explore new opportunities and new vision for the future.

It is also my hope that this sabbatical will provide me with greater resources to minister to my congregation over the next few years. With fresh vision, renewed energy, and reinvigorated motivation, I foresee unique benefits for both myself and the congregation.

5. Provide a similar statement written by a representative of the congregation that describes the intended benefits both for the congregation and the pastor. This statement should summarize the congregation's views and should be incorporated into the body of the proposal. Do not include letters from individual members of the congregation.

The members of Bethany Presbyterian are excited by and supportive of the proposed sabbatical for John. The Presbyterian church is very intentional in providing its pastors this time of renewal, as a sabbatical is highly recommended (if not required in some presbyteries) as part of the pastor's Terms of Call. We are very aware of the benefits to both the clergy and congregation. With the funds provided by the Lilly Endowment Clergy Renewal Program, in August of 2020 we can welcome home a pastor who has had time to enjoy leisure time with family and friends, has engaged in activities that feed his soul, has explored avenues of ministry that are interesting to him and will enrich and inform his future ministry with us, and has had time for renewal and relaxation.

Although most of us are not as technologically savvy as John, we understand the importance of the church being open to using technology in its ministry. John has paved the way for us in many ways - utilizing technology in communications, worship, and education. We are confident that this opportunity to explore this field of interest for him, will only enhance his ministry with us on his return.

As John shares his experiences with us, hopefully we will also be enriched and energized to live more fully into our faith in new and exciting ways.

This statement of support was prepared by a committee of church members who are working with John in preparation for his sabbatical, and was completed after conversations with approximately 20 other members - from youth and young adult, to older adult.


