Nostalgia is a strong emotion. As I get closer and closer to my retirement, nostalgia is almost an everyday occurrence for me. Memories of 42 years of ministry are strong, and

they fill my soul with good thoughts and wonderful remembrances.

Those of you who are on Facebook are aware of my weekly "Countdown to Retirement" posts with pictures of the past that I've collated. Going through these pictures has truly been a walk down memory lane. And then seeing the comments from those who have crossed my path over the years has been so gratifying.

As I look at these pictures I remember the experiences, for sure. But an even clearer and stronger memory are of the people that I have been privileged to meet over the years. The youth that have been a part of the programs in the churches that I have served continue to fill me with wonderful memories as I recall service trips and retreats and Montreat conferences and Sunday nights and lockins and youth choir musicals and on and on and on. So many amazing experiences over the years! And each one has informed my ministry in so many ways. Plus, they have certainly given me a great deal of sermon illustrations and inspiration!

But even as I have my bouts of nostalgia, my work here continues. I have been gratified by your response to my current sermon series on The Beatitudes. I have been challenged in my preaching on these familiar verses, and I hope that you have benefitted from what I have gleaned from my study and research. I can't believe that I have gone all this time and not preached on them. I have taught a series of classes on them, but never have preached on The Beatitudes. So, I am grateful that I have this opportunity to explore these words of Christ in a new way.

As you may or may not know, I do worship planning for three or four months ahead. So, I recently completed worship planning for May through August.

And yes, this takes me through the end of my time with you.

Here are some highlights for worship for the next four months. I will complete my series on The Beatitudes just in time for Pentecost Sunday on May $23^{\rm rd}$. For the end of May and through June, I will return to the Lectionary for sermon planning, concentrating mostly on the Gospel readings from Mark.

I will be away on the first and third Sundays of July, but beginning on July 25th, I will begin a final five-week sermon series on "The Gospel According to Baseball." There is a very personal and meaningful reason behind this series. As you know, my father was a Presbyterian minister. But he was also an avid baseball fan. Baseball was our thing. We spent many Saturday afternoons together watching the "CBS Game of the Week." Throwing the ball around outside was another of our pastimes.

My father taught me a lot about life. I draw on his inspiration daily in my quest to be a good pastor. But he also instilled in me my love of baseball and appreciation for the game. So, as my time as a pastor comes to an end, this will be my tribute to my father. I hope I can do the series justice.

Planning my final Sunday with you (August 29th) was emotional. Choosing the hymns that I want sung was surprisingly easy, but definitely emotional as I thought about the words and what they mean. I picked two scripture passages that have always meant something special for me: Micah 6:6-8, and Isaiah 40:28-31. The sermon title is taken from the highly acclaimed TV show "Friday Night Lights," as I will preach on "Clear Eyes, Full Heart, Can't Lose."

I know the next four months will fly by, and I know that we will properly celebrate when the time comes. Bear with me as I reminisce, and if I get nostalgic, I know you'll understand.

As always, I am grateful to be your pastor.

WATCH LIVE WORSHIP



What a joy it has been to gather in-person for worship for the past few weeks. Being able to experience Easter Sunday with our church family was so joyous and soul-filling. As we continue to worship in-person, we will also continue to offer online options for those who are not able to join us in person - because of health issues, being out of town, or just a choice!

Our Bethany Stream Team has been hard at work with the goal of making our online worship as close to the experience of being at worship in-person as possible. There have been challenges along the way, but we are making progress and hopefully we'll get to where we want to be very soon.

One of our goals was to make our live stream as easy as possible to access. We realize that those who have been joining via Zoom have been having some issues. Although we will continue to offer the Zoom option for the time being, we are encouraging our "Zoomers" to explore a new option that we feel will be a better experience. Here's some information on that option:

- We are using a streaming service called **Boxcast**. In each week's worship email (which you should receive on Saturday mornings) there will be a link to the worship page on our website (https:// www.bethanypreschurch.org/worship--bethany.html). There you will find a link to our Sunday morning live stream. This is the easiest way to get the live stream.
- The live stream is also going to Facebook Live and YouTube Live, and can be accessed on either of these platforms. But again, the easiest way to access the live stream is on our worship page as indicated above.
- In addition, you can find our live stream on Apple TV, Roku, or Amazon Fire TV streaming sites. If you subscribe to any of these services, just search for "Boxcast" and once you have that app, you can search for Bethany and watch our live stream on your TV!
- Recordings of each service will be available on the worship page on our website, as well as on our Facebook page.
- Our live stream will include not only the live camera feed from the sanctuary, but also the slides that you would see on the screen if you were in-person.

Those who continue on Zoom will have a little different stream, but you should see everything as well. But, as was mentioned above, we encourage those using Zoom to explore this other upgraded option and we feel that this will be easier and problem-free!

We are so grateful for the technology that has enabled us to continue to worship together over the past year during the pandemic. And we are grateful that this technology continues to improve and expand that gives us even more options to continue our online opportunities.

If you have any problems getting online, please don't hesitate to contact us and let us know what's going on. We are ever-aware that technology always presents challenges, but we are confident as we move forward that we can offer high quality options for viewing our live stream.

The team has had an initial meeting with our Presbytery / COM liaison Amanda Anderson. She helped us to understand what our role is as a team during the transition process.

Amanda and COM will begin to determine the availability of Interim ministers who may be ending current assignments, or who are ready for a new call. She will assist the team in all phases of the process of finding our Interim pastor.

We discussed potential options for celebrating John in his retirement.

We obtained session approval to invite the congregation to donate towards a fund to be used for Retirement gift/s for John. Donations should be earmarked for "John's Retirement".


We meet again on Thursday April 29th.

Please note the Pastoral Change Flow Chart provided by the presbytery, which kind of gives a visual image of what the transition may look like. Some of this has evolved over the years and may look a little different now, but this gives an overall picture of what Bethany can expect over the next little while. And yes, it may be a while before Bethany calls its next pastor. The work of the Transitional Pastor usually takes about 18 months or longer. Patience is key in listening to the Spirit and doing the necessary work of transition so that that unique mission and ministry of Bethany and continue unabated moving forward.

Please make it a regular practice to keep the Transition Team in your daily prayers. And watch this space each month to keep up-to-date on the work of the team. God has great things in store for Bethany. Consider the possibilities!

Flowering of the Cross Easter Sunday







What a joy it was to gather back in person on Palm Sunday, and the Sundays following. Thanks to all who have joined us in person for adhering to our guidelines. As we continue to recover from the pandemic, and as restrictions continue to ease, we will continue to adjust our guidelines here at Bethany. But for now, here's what you need to know:

- There are four options for worshipping with your Bethany family: in person here in the sanctuary, via Zoom online, or via Facebook live and YouTube Live (see page 2 for updates). Refer to your weekly emails or the Watch Worship page on our website for the links to online worship.
- If you choose to worship in person, here are the guidelines that we will follow:
 - Masks must be worn at all times.
 - **Social-distancing** will be observed. Every other pew will be blocked off. We have a beautiful large sanctuary. We can use it all!
 - Hand sanitizer and wipes will be available.
 - Offering plates will be placed at the door to receive the offering.
 - As you exit the sanctuary following worship, you will be asked to observe social-distancing guidelines
 and not congregate in close groups. It's hard not to because we want to visit, but we must remain
 safe.



Hymn Stories

During the month of May we recognize two significant Sundays – Pentecost (May 23) and Trinity (May 30). One of the most beloved of our hymns, "Holy, Holy, Holy! Lord God Almighty", is utilized during both of these special services. Following is the story behind this well-known hymn.

And they do not rest day or night, saying: "Holy, holy, holy, Lord God Almighty, who was and is and is to come!" Revelation 4:8

Reginald Heber was born in 1783 to a minister and his wife in an English village. He enrolled at Oxford where he excelled in poetry. Following graduation, he succeeded his father as vicar in his family's parish. And for 16 years he faithfully served his flock.

His bent toward poetry naturally gave him a keen and growing interest in hymnody. He sought to lift the literary quality of hymns and dreamed of publishing a collection of high-caliber corresponding to the church year for use by liturgical churches. But the Bishop of London would not support his efforts and his dream was curtailed.

He continued writing hymns for his own church and it was during those 16 years that he wrote all 57 of his hymns, including the great missionary hymn, "From Greenland's Icy Mountains", which exhorted missionaries to take the gospel to faraway places like "Greenland's icy mountains" and "India's coral strand".

This hymn represented an earnest desire for Reginald. For he felt God was calling him as a missionary to India's coral strand. His desire was fulfilled in 1822 when, at age 40, he was appointed to oversee the Church of England's ministries in India.

Arriving in Calcutta he set out on a 16-month tour of his diocese, visiting mission stations across India. In February of 1826 he left for another tour. While in the village of Trichinopoly on April 3rd. he preached to a large crowd in the hot sun, and afterwards plunged into a pool of cool water. He suffered a stroke and drowned!

It was after his death that his widow, finding his 57 hymns in a trunk, succeeded in publishing his *Hymns Written and Adapted to the Weekly Service of the Church Year*. In this volume was the great hymn, "Holy, Holy, Holy"!
