The last several newsletters have given you a little introduction to the advance planning that is continuing as I prepare for my anticipated three-month sabbatical, May-July of 2020. The Sabbatical Support Group (Helen Brown, Ron Kimrey, Sandy Russell, and Tracey Troxler) met several times over several months spanning the end of 2018 and the beginning of 2019. There was much work involved in getting the proposal and application for the Lilly Foundation grant. According to the instructions and information, recipients will not be notified until late August. Fingers are firmly crossed!

As a way of further keeping you informed, over the next few months, I will continue to share in this space the responses to one of the narrative questions that is included in the application. So, here is the next question and answer -

Number 6.

6. Describe the congregation's plans for covering the necessary pastoral functions during the pastor's absence, for celebration of the pastor's leave-taking and return, and/or for programs or activities that will serve to renew the congregation as a whole. Up to \$15,000 may be used for such purposes and should be allocated as the congregation deems appropriate. (Note: These expenses should be included in the congregation's budget for the renewal program.)

We are blessed at Bethany that one of our members, Rick Purcell, is a Commissioned Ruling Elder (an official role as defined in the *Book of Order* of the Presbyterian Church (USA)), commissioned by Salem Presbytery as Chaplain of the Graham, NC Police Department. He also currently serves as our Clerk of Session. He would assume all pastoral duties during the sabbatical, including planning and leading worship, preaching, and any pastoral care obligations. He would be compensated in accordance with the presbytery guidelines for CREs.

We would anticipate having a send-off luncheon or reception before the sabbatical begins, and a celebration upon the pastor's return, which would be in the form of a potluck dinner, and a visual presentation about the sabbatical.

It is anticipated that the congregation will be in prayer throughout the sabbatical - both formal and individual. It is anticipated as well, that an appropriate book or Bible study will be offered to the congregation during the sabbatical, that would correspond with the focus of the sabbatical itself. We would invite guest leaders for these events to perhaps give a different face on the study.

Please know that everyone is welcome to stop by Bill and Linda's to see the daylilies any time in June. And we look forward to sharing this special celebration with them in August!


FEASTING on the WORD

Join us this summer for a unique new **Sunday School Series.** This series will use the "Feasting on the Word" curriculum, which follows the Revised Common Lectionary scripture passages. Each Sunday's session will center on the text from which John will be preaching on that particular Sunday. The series will be led by John, with exceptions when he is out of town, and will meet in the classroom across from the offices. **We will gather each Sunday at 9:45 for coffee and refreshments, and will finish up by 10:30.**

The hope for this series is to provide a deeper look at the text for each Sunday, which will hopefully lead to a richer worship experience as the same text is used to build the worship service around.

So make your plans to join us for our **first session on Sunday, June 2nd** - continuing through August for this "new-look" Sunday school learning opportunity.





For our Summer Study Series this summer, we will re-visit a format we used several years ago - **The Grill & The Gospel**, beginning on **Sunday**, **June 9**th. 




Montreat Youth Conference:


