The Way Forward Commission, the All Agency Review Committee, and the 2020 Vision Team, all presented reports to the assembly on Sunday, with recommendations going to committees and then coming back for assembly voting later in the week.

It was also gratifying to see the work of the committee on which I have been serving, looking at the future of Christian Education in the church in the 21st century, also give its report to the assembly on Sunday. It's recommendations also now go to a committee and then - if approved - will come back to the whole body for a vote.

I love my church and I am always gratified to see it working as it should. We may not all agree on every issue that is voted on, but we can be certain that all sides of every issue are fully heard. Having been a commissioner to a previous assembly (2012), I know this for a fact.

Let us continue to keep our church - national, regional, and local - in our prayers, to the end that the message of Jesus Christ is clearly communicated to a hurting and hungry world.

July 8th: The Answer to Division is Community July 15th: The Answer to Passivity is Passion










Sunday, July 15th - 6:30 pm

Congregation Votes to Sell Property

At a duly called Congregational Meeting on Sunday, June 3rd, the congregation voted to approve the recommendation of the Session to sell the property owned by the church directly across Highway 87 (Main Street) from the church. This property includes the house that had been previously offered as rental property, and the large vacant lot. The sale also includes the adjacent property owned by the Patterson family. The sale is contingent on obtaining access to sewer and water at the rear of the property, which involves either the three parties involved (buyer, Patterson, Bethany) together purchasing a small piece, or obtaining easement rights through this small tract. This is being worked out now.

After many years of renting the property, the last few of which were filled with late, partial, or no rent payments, the Session made the decision to pursue the sale of the property. Many thanks goes to Elder Glenn Patterson for his time and energy devoted to the real estate side of this issue.

Once the sewer and water issue is resolved, the congregation will make a final vote on the sale. Stay tuned!



Elder Vilmarie Cintron-Olivieri and Rev. Cindy Kohlmann Elected Co-Moderators of PCUSA

New Moderators Want to Celebrate Diversity and Think Outside the Box



Humbled and overjoyed is how the new co-moderators of the 223rd General Assembly said they felt after Saturday night's close election. Appearing at their first news conference, Ruling Elder Vilmarie Cintrón-Olivieri and the Rev. Cindy Kohlmann said the last few months have been "an incredible journey" and they are ready to move forward. "We will be surprising and do things in ways the church hasn't necessarily experienced before," said Kohlmann. "Some of that will be around the expectations of who should do what. Who should preach? Who should show up at clergy or ruling elder conferences? We want to do things that we feel called to, not necessarily what traditional expectations might want to dictate."

The pair were among three teams of candidates seeking to succeed Co-Moderators Denise Anderson and Jan Edmiston of the 222nd General Assembly.

"We thought all of the candidates could do this job," Cintrón-Olivieri joked. "I appreciated the collegiality, love and hope that was shared across the teams. It was a good journey and we appreciated the opportunity to stand with them. I thought it was a fair process and spirit led. If it took four ballots, that's what the spirit wanted." Cintrón-Olivieri, who grew up in Puerto Rico, is an ESL teacher and ruling elder at First Spanish Presbyterian Church in Miami. Kohlmann currently serves as Resource Presbyter for the presbyteries of Boston and Northern

Introduced by a mutual friend, the newly-elected pair believe their different backgrounds will serve them well as they look to address diversity in a changing church.

"Music is one of the places where we can be diverse and united," Kohlmann said. "We have immigrant communities in the greater Boston area. When I worship with them, it doesn't matter that I don't understand a single word we sing together," she added. "Part of celebrating diversity is helping people experience it in a way that is joyful and life giving."

"There is a way to do worship that might be simpler than we think," said Cintrón-Olivieri. "Perhaps an interpretation system or presenting music and preaching in a different language. We just need to find the people to do that." Both believe placing more emphasis on people and less on buildings will make a difference.

"If the church building wasn't there, there would not be a place for community to be together," said Kohlmann. "It's not about leaving the building behind. It's about not making the building the first thing we talk about in annual reports. It's what we use to do the mission of Christ."

Cintrón-Olivieri says churches are using their facilities in new ways to connect with communities.

"We need to think outside of the box and look for ways to make the building the center of community," she said.

"We need to determine how it can be a safe space where people gather for worship on Sundays and for other purposes during the week."

Both have embraced what the church is doing to welcome immigrants to the United States and believe it is a "rich blessing" for the PC(USA).
