Some random thoughts as we near the mid-summer mark (calendar-wise):

• I have been so pleased with the response to our

Feasting on the Word series that we began at on the first Sunday in June. We have had really good discussions during the Sunday school hour, as we have dug a little deeper into the text from which I will be preaching that morning. It has been gratifying to see how the discussions can inform my preaching, and hopefully vice versa as well.

- I was also thrilled at the response to our first *The* Grill and the Gospel event on June 9th. The food was great, but even better was our discussion. We are looking at Adam Hamilton's book and study, "Why? Making Sense of God's Will." We will continue this series on July 7th and August 11th, so please join us. The last several newsletters have given you a little introduction to the advance planning that is continuing as I prepare for my anticipated threemonth sabbatical, May-July of 2020. The Sabbatical Support Group (Helen Brown, Ron Kimrey, Sandy Russell, and Tracey Troxler) met several times over several months spanning the end of 2018 and the beginning of 2019. There was much work involved in getting the proposal and application for the Lilly Foundation grant. According to the instructions and information, recipients will not be notified until late August. Fingers are firmly crossed!

As a way of further keeping you informed, I will continue to share in this space the responses to one of the narrative questions that is included in the application. So, here is the next question and answer - Number 7.

7. Tell how the pastor and the congregation will communicate and share insights from the renewal program with one another after the pastor returns from the renewal leave. Please note that we do not anticipate contact between pastor and congregation during the renewal leave unless it is absolutely necessary.

A few weeks after the return - giving time to put a program together, the pastor would present a program at a family night dinner (or similar event) that would tell the story of the sabbatical in detail. This would include photographs, videos, and other forms of communication that will help share the experience with the congregation. It would also include information on how this experience fulfilled the original goal, and steps that will now be taken to continue the fulfillment of these goals.

The pastor will present a sermon series on his return, incorporating appropriate scripture to tell the story of the sabbatical experience, and to outline future goals and challenges for the congregation.

The pastor will maintain a blog during the sabbatical - sharing photos and experiences along the way. Insights from this blog will also be shared with the congregation, with the hopes that this would lead to a more in-depth study or conversation over a period of time.


## FEASTING on the WORD

Join us this summer for a unique new **Sunday School Series.** This series will use the "Feasting on the Word" curriculum, which follows the Revised Common Lectionary scripture passages. Each Sunday's session will center on the text from which John will be preaching on that particular Sunday. The series will be led by John, with exceptions when he is out of town, and will meet in the classroom across from the offices. **We will gather each Sunday at 9:45 for coffee and refreshments, and will finish up by 10:30.** 

The hope for this series is to provide a deeper look at the text for each Sunday, which will hopefully lead to a richer worship experience as the same text is used to build the worship service around.

So make your plans to join us as we continue in this format throughout the summer!





For our Summer Study Series this summer, we will re-visit a format we used several years ago - **The Grill & The Gospel**, continuing on **Sunday**, **July 7th**. This summer we are looking at another Adam Hamilton study, called **Why? Making Sense of God's Will.** Our three sessions will look at: Why Do the Innocent Suffer?, Why Do My Prayers Go Unanswered?, and Why Can't I See God's Will For My Life? As with other Adam Hamilton series that we've looked at, this is a DVD based series, with discussion and sharing.

So, mark your calendars for **July 7<sup>th</sup>**, **and August 11<sup>th</sup>**, as we gather for great food, fantastic fellowship, and engaging discussion on the many "why" questions of life!

### Friends of SHE

If you were in worship on June 23<sup>rd</sup>, you may have noticed that John was wearing a new stole. This stole was a gift from Debbie, and was purchased at a booth for the Friends of SHE at the APCE conference in January. (John hasn't worn the stole before now because it was too long and had to be altered. Thanks Linda Abplanalp!)

The SHE Project is a program in Pakistan to offer at risk women a safe place to exist, as well as to offer life skills. **SHE is an acronym for Struggle - Hope - Empowerment.** The Friends of SHE is the U. S. Partner of this program.

From the Friends of SHE website (www.friendsofshe.com): What would you do if you were a victim of radical violence? A single mom with no job or prospects? If you couldn't read or write? If your home was no longer a safe place for your children and relatives turned you away?

The SHE Project began in 2006 as a program called "Girls at Risk." When several Christian churches and homes in Sangla Hill were burned by radical Muslims, a number of women and children had no place to go. The Presbyterian Education Board of Pakistan (PEB) — already known for providing Christian and Muslim children with a great education — saw these women in distress. Housing was provided at a PEB boarding house, bringing their critical needs to the attention of PEB.


- Sunday school for Youth and Children / Meets on second floor of Education Building at 9:45 each Sunday
