Rick's Reflections

Wait! What? Ordinary Time! Are you kidding me?

But that is the time we are in... according to the Church Calendar. Where in the world did we get that kind of calendar?

Well, it all started, more or less, with the Hebrews keeping track of their festivals. Now they did follow some form of either solar calendar (based on the relative position between the sun and earth), lunar calendar (corresponding to the cycles of the moon), or a combination of both, a lunisolar one. That way, the Hebrews could keep their obligation to present themselves before God three times a year: 1) at the Festival of Pesach (Passover), 2) at the Festival of Weeks (Harvest Festival, traditionally 7 weeks from the start of harvest), and 3) at the Festival of Sukkot (celebrating the wandering in the desert with only their tents and God for protection). There were other festivals, but these were the three called the Pilgrimage Festivals in which they would travel to the Temple in Jerusalem as commanded in the Torah. After the destruction of the Second Temple (70 CE), the trip was not obligatory.

Fast forward (really?) to the 3rd and 4th centuries. Sometime before year 380, the practice of commemorating the birth of Christ was done on December 25th. An early Church Father named John Chrysostom announced this to his congregation in 386, but it did not really catch on until the fifth century. From the Nativity season, Epiphany, Lent, Triduum (Tenebrae), Easter, Pentecost were tracked in sequence in an early Church or Liturgical Calendar, until these Christian "Festival" were overlaid on the Gregorian calendar (1582).

So now we are into the Ordinary Time. The name comes from the same root as 'ordinal' which refers to things in 'numbered order'. In a sense, Ordinary Time means 'the counted weeks' between our Christian Festivals. Our times we are living in now are anything but ordinary or usual. From the COVID-19 pandemic, to the racial unrest, from economic catastrophe and political tension, we are experiencing a time of turmoil to say the least.

Here is an idea: let's make this time 'extraordinary'. Rather than a way of just marking the time between festivals, why not actively look for ways the Church can demonstrate the presence of God in the Liturgical Ordinary Time. This can be an opportunity to clarify God's presence in everyday life. To quote Theologian Paul Fiddes, "Wherever there is the movement of a measure of music, or a stroke of a brush, or a blow of a chisel, or a sequence of thought in the arts or science, which reflects God's truth and beauty, this too shares in the dynamic flow of the life of God." This is not just looking at the world through rose colored glasses, it is changing our perspective to be more God focused. We are allowed to look for the activity of God in the world, and in our attempts at understanding what is opened up by God, we can shape our actions and prayers to guide the ordinary on the road to extraordinary.



UPDATED INSTRUCTIONS!



The past month or so has had us gathering to worship "virtually" using the Zoom video conferencing platform. It has been gratifying to see more and more of you joining us on Sunday mornings, but there were others who had some issues connecting. Hopefully these instructions can help get more of us together this Sunday.

If you are using a laptop or desktop computer, you can connect to a Zoom meeting on your web browser (Chrome, Safari, etc.). If you connect on a smartphone or tablet, you can also connect via a web browser, but it is easier to download the Zoom app from your App Store (it is free).

When your weekly e-newsletter is sent on Thursday or Friday morning, it will include a link to this Sunday's service. DON'T CLICK ON THE LINK UNTIL YOU ARE READY TO CONNECT ON SUNDAY MORNING!

When you click on the link, it will send you either to your web browser or the Zoom app. If you get a pop-up question about permission to connect, just say yes.

You will first be sent to a "waiting room" for a brief time, until one of the hosts of the meeting will let you in. This is a security feature that we have added to help protect us from having folks that are up to no good getting in the meeting.

Once you are in the meeting, make sure that your video is on. Go to the bottom left corner of your screen (on a computer; tap the screen on a tablet or phone) and make sure there's not a red line through the video camera icon.

If you are on a laptop or desktop, it's better if you enter full screen mode.

You can also connect from a cell phone or land line. The phone-in number with the meeting ID number will be included in the email with the link.

One important note: if you phone in on a land line, there is no way to mute you, so all audio from your connection will be heard by everyone. Keep that in mind!

If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to either email or text me. (Call the church if you don't have my number - I don't want to put my phone # out for scammers to grab it!)

Another option for joining the service will be on Facebook Live - hopefully! There is a feature of Zoom which allows direct streaming from Zoom to Facebook live. We actually got this to work on April 26th, so hopefully the bugs have been ironed out and there will be this option as well.

If you want to learn more about Zoom, you can go to their website (<u>www.zoom.us</u>) where there are lots of tutorials, or just go to YouTube and search for Zoom tutorials.

And we remember that the church is not closed. The building is, but the people are the church and we will continue to gather in this way. It is such a wonderful thing to see everyone's faces appear on my screen every Sunday. Join us!
