two weeks prior, their home was inviting and welcoming to their first house guests!

I'm not much of a big city person, but Minneapolis is a wonderful place to visit, and from Jackie and Tave's viewpoint, a wonderful place to live. This visit gave me a lot to think about when it comes to being good neighbors. On Saturday of the week we were up there, we were able to take part in a block party on the block where they live the 4700 block of Blaisdell Avenue in Minneapolis. We learned that this was the 35th year of holding this block party!

And what a wonderful time we had. The street was full of children, youth, adults of the same generation as Jackie and Tave, adults our age, and some older. Everyone brought food, folks brought chairs to sit on, and it was truly a wonderful time of fellowship. This is what a neighborhood should look like. I know that Jackie and Tave will enjoy fixing up their home and becoming a part of this wonderful neighborhood.

This summer has seen another reminder of what being a neighbor is all about, with the release of the documentary film "Won't You Be My Neighbor" - telling the story of Mister Rogers and his neighborhood.

This simple TV show for children originated in Pittsburgh in 1968. Its syndication brought this unique show into homes all across the country.

Fred Rogers was the host, writer, composer, and just about everything else for the show. He was an ordained Presbyterian minister (a fact that many people don't know!), and his ministry with Mr. Rogers Neighborhood was a validated ministry of Pittsburgh Presbytery. In fact, he was ordained to this ministry.

We had the pleasure of seeing the movie while we were on vacation. I came away with the feeling that this should be required viewing for every citizen of our country. His kindness, compassion, and caring for all of God's people

was so evident as this show continued. One example of his influence: in the late 60's and early 70's (and unfortunately even today), race relations were a hot button issue. There was an incident where African-American children and adults were swimming in a public pool, but were harassed to the point of people pouring bleach into the water to "cleanse" the pool.

Mr. Rogers rightly thought this was horrendous. One of the characters on his show was a black policeman. Never once mentioning racism or this incident, he dealt with it powerfully and simply. Sitting on the set he had his bare feet in a little kiddie pool, commenting on what a hot day it was and how cooling and refreshing the cool water was.

Francois, the policeman came up and Mr. Rogers invited him to join him. So, there they sat, two of God's creatures, black and white, sharing the coolness of water - together. What a powerful lesson for our children.

As I begin a new sermon series on the last Sunday of July, I will be talking more about being good neighbors. This series is on the Ten Commandments, and we are reminded that so many of them speak as to how we should treat our neighbors. So, it was a fabulous vacation, but it is also always good to get home. I'll have one more Sunday off on August 12th (see the info about Youth Sunday on Page 5) as I participate with some friends in my annual trek to see the Atlanta Braves play. And then I'll be around for awhile.

I appreciate the opportunity to get away and renew and refresh. It gives me the rest I need away from work, and makes me better able to do my job to the best of my ability.

I hope each of you have had opportunities as well to get away with family and friends. After all, isn't that what summer is supposed to be about! But alas, it's August, and another summer is about to be gone. But we rejoice in the life we have as God's people, and the life we share here at Bethany!
