I'm not sure if you know it or not, but there's an election going on! It's hard to miss with the onslaught of TV ads and the yard signs and 24-hour news cycles

with the latest updates on what is happening on the campaign trails of the candidates.

I think a good incentive to vote early would be to somehow make it so that when you voted, then you wouldn't have to see any more ads on TV. I would be first in line!

Yes, we are in the midst of an election season, and also in the midst of a pandemic, which makes voting even more important, with the hope of keeping it safe as well.

Unlike some pastors that we see on the news, I will never tell you how to vote. I will only encourage you **TO VOTE!** Those of you who are friends with me on Facebook know that I never post anything political. During the time we were together at Wake Forest, was about the time that the marriage equality question was the hot topic in our denomination. John and I were at different ends of the spectrum in our thoughts on this topic.

But our differences didn't hurt our friendship or our ministry. In fact, we wrote a newsletter article together - kind of a point/counterpoint thing - where several questions were posed and we answered the questions from our own perspectives.

This went over very well in the congregation and served as a prime example of how people with vastly different opinions can disagree but still be friends.

We have to get away from the "my way or the highway" approach. We have to learn to get along no matter who we might support in an election.

On November 3rd we will see the culmination of a long election season. I invite you all to be in prayer as this will be as important an election as any we may have seen in our lifetimes. Here are some things I encourage us all to pray for:

- That all who wish to vote will be able to exercise their civic duty safely and securely, and that all ballots will be counted
- That no matter the outcome of the election, that our country will be a place of peace and civility
- That if the election mandates it, that a smooth transition of power be observed
- That all of our elected leaders will look to their hearts so they may serve the American people with compassion and love

I have no idea what we will wake up to on November 4th. At least I know that I won't have to endure any more political ads for awhile.



Stewardship during a pandemic is an interesting phenomenon. But as we say every week, the needs of the church continue unabated, and so we must plan for our 2020 Stewardship Season. As you can see from the above graphic, we will celebrate this season during the first four Sundays of November. Having Consecration Sunday on November 22nd, the Sunday before Thanksgiving, makes our theme of Gratitude even more relevant!

Our theme passage is 1 Thessalonians 5:12-18, an excerpt of which can be seen above. Taking four imperatives from this passage as our themes for the four Sundays, we will focus on the themes of: *Live in Peace, Rejoice Always, Pray Continually,* and *Give Thanks*.

Our Generosity Team (Helen Brown, Glenn Patterson, Tina Patterson, Seth Smith & Morgan Troxler) is making plans for these important four weeks. Our Consecration Sunday celebration may look a little different from what we have done in the past due to Covid concerns, but we will celebrate appropriately and safely.

Our worship services during these four weeks will each highlight one of the four Ministry Areas - Worship, Serve, Teach, and Support, and members of our Generosity Team will present Moments for Mission on these Sundays focusing on these areas of mission and ministry.

Watch your mail for important correspondence that will be coming soon. Please keep Bethany in your prayers as we continue to learn what it means to be a church in the middle of a pandemic.

At this writing, we have made it through four Sundays with in-person worship, and things seem to be going pretty smoothly. Thank you to those who have made it to church for adhering to the guidelines and protocols that have been put in place. As always, our goal is to keep everyone safe, and to offer options for worship. Here are some reminders:

- There will be three options for worshipping with your Bethany family: in person here in the sanctuary, via Zoom online, or via Facebook (and possibly YouTube) live.
- If you choose to worship in person, here are the guidelines that we will follow:
 - Masks must be worn at all times.
 - **Social-distancing** will be observed. Every other pew will be blocked off. We have a beautiful large sanctuary. We can use it all!
 - Hand sanitizer and wipes will be available.
 - Offering plates will be placed at the door to receive the offering.
 - As you exit the sanctuary following worship, you will be asked to observe social-distancing guidelines
 and not congregate in close groups. It's hard not to because we want to visit, but we must remain
 safe.
 - The service will be on the screen as usual, or the digital bulletin will be available for download to your tablet or smartphone.
- I will preach from the floor so that we can continue our Zoom and Facebook live worship. Special request: if you worship on Facebook live, please leave a comment so that we know you are there!
- PLEASE, PLEASE IF YOU FEEL ANY UNEASE ABOUT ATTENDING WORSHIP IN PERSON, PLEASE STAY AT HOME! As much as we would like to see you, safety is our number one concern.

I am so happy that we have reached a point where we have this option to worship in person. I am looking forward to seeing you soon - if not in person then on my computer screen. Be safe, wear a mask, keep your distance, so that we can beat this thing!



We have tried to keep you informed of the many changes taking place with our presbytery, and the summer of 2020 certainly saw much in the way of transition. As mentioned recently, we saw the retirement of Rev. Steve Smith who had been serving as Transitional General Presbyter.

The search committee for a new Transitional General Presbyter has been hard at work and we are thrilled to welcome **Rev. Dr. Barbara Smith** (pictured below) to Salem beginning on November 1st. She comes with much experience and glowing recommendations in working with presbyteries in transition. We look forward to her ministry with us here in Salem Presbytery.

The staff of the presbytery continues to adjust to new working environments following the sale of the presbytery office. Laurie Scott, the office manager is working from her home, and Renee Carter, financial secretary, and Peggy Trenchard, administrative assistant, are working in office space provided by Clemmons Presbyterian Church.

The office phone number remains the same and works just like everyone is in the same building.

Continue to offer prayers for our presbytery as we continue in this period of transition and adjusting to new ways of being. And continue to offer prayers for our presbytery committees as their work has increased with fewer staff in place.





Several of you have ventured into the digital world to download our **Interactive Digital Sunday Bulletin** to use during worship on Sunday mornings. Here's what you need to do to join in:

- Bring your iPad or tablet or smartphone to worship with you (either at home or when we return to the sanctuary.
- Scan the QR code (you can use your smartphone camera or there are many QR code apps available) that will be in that Sunday's regular bulletin, or on the screen (see below)
- That will take you to the webpage where our bulletin resides.
- 1 You probably can just begin using it there, or you may need to download it.
- 1 It will appear on your screen just like a regular Sunday bulletin.
- For the hymns, just tap on the hymn title and the hymn will appear on your screen just like you would see it in the hymnbook.
- Tap on the scripture and it will come up also.
- If John uses graphics or images during his sermon, those will be indicated as well so you can link to them and then back to the bulletin.
- The QR code here will link to the bulletin for September 20th so you can practice!





"Come, Ye Thankful People, Come"

The theme for 2020 Stewardship Season is taken from one of the most beloved of the harvest hymns, Come, Ye Thankful People, Come. It was written by Dean Alford in 1844. This harvest hymn first appeared in with the title, "After Harvest". It was originally accompanied by the text, He that goeth forth and weepeth, bearing precious seed, shall doubtless come again with rejoicing, bringing his sheaves with him. (Psalm 126:6)

When Alford was sixteen years old, he wrote these noble words upon the fly-leaf of his Bible: *I do this day, in the presence of God*

and my own soul, renew my covenant with God, and solemnly determine henceforth to become His, and to do His work as far as in me lies.

We look forward to revisiting this hymn as well as some of our other favorites leading up to Thanksgiving like "We Gather Together", "Give Thanks" and "Now Thank We All Our God".

(The following history has been extracted from Wikipedia)

Alford wrote "Come, Ye Thankful People, Come" in 1844 while he was the rector of Aston Sandford church in Buckinghamshire, England. It was first published in *Hymns and Psalms* in 1844 with seven verses under the title "After Harvest". "Come, Ye Thankful People, Come" was set to George J. Elvey's hymn tune *St. George's*, *Windsor* in 1858.

In 1865, Alford revised the hymn, and it was republished in his *Poetical Works* with only four verses. In 1861 there had been a number of unofficial revisions of the hymn, including in "one in *Hymns Ancient and Modern*, which led to Alford publishing a footnote in *Poetical Works* stating his disapproval of these revisions that had been made without his agreement. Despite this, Alford revised the hymn again in 1867 in *Year of Praise*.

Alford was a moderate who attempted to keep good relations between non-conformists and the High Church Anglicans in the Church of England: "Come, Ye Thankful People, Come" is commonly found in evangelical hymn books as are Alford's "Forward Be Our Watchword" and "Ten Thousand Times Ten Thousand". [4] The hymn later gained popularity in the United States where it is used as part of Thanksgiving celebrations.

The first verse is written as a celebration of the <u>harvest</u>, calling for people to give thanks to God for it. [5] The last two verses are based on the <u>Parable of the Tares</u>, and discuss the last harvest at the <u>Second Coming of Jesus</u>. [1]
