First of all, a word of thanks for all the good wishes, the prayers, and positive vibes sent my way during and after my surgery on November 11th. For those reading this who

may not have heard, I needed to undergo prostate surgery to alleviate other problems related to that pesky gland! I am truly grateful that there were no signs of cancer. But, removal of the prostate was certainly called for and accomplished.

In the few weeks post-procedure, I have been feeling better, and healing a little bit every day. I am hoping to be back to 100% very soon. I return for my post-op visit with the surgeon on December 18th. Again, thank you for your concerns and prayers.

The end of the year always - at least for me - makes me a little nostalgic as I look over the past year and think about all that has happened. And it has been quite a year.

In January I assumed the role of co-moderator of Salem Presbytery's COM (Commission on Ministry). This has been a worthwhile role in my service to the larger church, as we welcome new pastors to the presbytery, say goodbye to those leaving and those retiring, and lend a helping hand to churches in conflict and churches in transition. I am grateful to be able to serve in this way.

January also saw my participation in the annual conference of the Association of Presbyterian Church Educators (APCE) in Galveston, TX. This is always a highlight of the year for me as I have time with friends and colleagues, and also learn about ways that I can be a better pastor and educator. I served in leadership roles with APCE for many, many years, and beginning at the conclusion of the 2020 event in Little Rock, I will return to service on the Governance Ministry Team. I look forward to serve this amazing organization again.

2019 also saw me continue my service on the General Assembly Special Committee to Study the Reformed Perspective of Christian Education in the 21st Century (the world's longest committee name!). The committee - comprised of folks from across the country and Puerto Rico, meets regular via video teleconference, and gathered for a face-to-face meeting in Montreat in August. We will meet again face-to-face in January for a few days at the Ferncliff Camp and Conference Center near Little Rock, and will hopefully finish up our work which will be presented to the General Assembly next summer.

June was an interesting month as Debbie underwent her hand surgery, which limited our time at the Montreat Music and Worship Conference. But we are grateful that she got her issues taken care of and is healing well.

We were grateful to be able to take some vacation time in July and visit Jackie in Minneapolis, and then were truly blessed to travel with dear friends on our Canadian Rockies train excursion in October.

And so, here we are at the end of another year. What has 2019 brought to you? For some, I know it is heartache as you mourn the loss of a loved one. For others, it is the joy of watching children grow up and learn to be their own person.

And now we turn our eyes to 2020. Will our vision be perfect? Doubtful! As we journey through the Advent and Christmas seasons, may we seek to be the people God wants us to be. Quoting something I saw on Twitter the other day, *"Strive each day to be the reason someone smiles today!"* If we can do that, then the world will be a better place.

As always, I am grateful to be your pastor.





BETHANY ANGEL TREE 2019

This year the Presbyterian Women have decided to again adopt KidsPath and Eldercare families for the Christmas Season. The Angel Tree is loaded and ready for you now!! Just in time for your "Black Friday" shopping. NOTE – IF PURCHASING CLOTHING – GIFT RECEIPTS ARE GOOD TO HAVE IF POSSIBLE.

<u>KidsPath</u>

KidsPath is a division of Hospice of Alamance/Caswell. KidsPath provides services to families with children who are experiencing a life-threatening illness. They also provide grief counseling to children who have lost a loved one. KidsPath assists these families in many ways. In participating with our Angel Tree, we help out with Christmas gifts for the sick children and their siblings. This helps the parents who are struggling monetarily from the effects that a life-threatening illness can bring to a family. Often one parent has to quit their job to help care for the ailing child. Traveling to hospitals, overnight stays, paying for food when the child is in the hospital, surgeries, chemo, and overall medical costs are devastating to these families at times. Our generosity helps make Christmas merrier and less stressful for these families facing a crisis with a child.

Alamance Eldercare

Alamance Eldercare provides assistance to Elderly citizens in our area who have very little to no family to assist them. These citizens usually still live in their homes, many of them alone, and have no one to make their Christmas special. In participating in our Angel Tree effort, we help provide these beautiful people who are often overlooked, with some simple Christmas cheer!!!

How does the Angel Tree work?

The social workers who are familiar and are assisting these families interview the families and come up with "wish lists". These lists are turned over to us at Bethany, and we place the items requested on Angels (for KidsPath) or Snowflakes (For Eldercare). Each KidsPath child or Eldercare patron will have <u>multiple</u> Angels/Snowflakes represented on the tree.

Don't like to shop? - Donate and we will shop for you!

If you would rather give a monetary donation, and let us do the shopping, please give the money to Tina Patterson, or Brenda Sykes, OR via donation to the church – specify Angel Tree fund - by Thursday, December 12th. Monetary donations will be used to purchase items for unclaimed Angels, Christmas meals for the families, and to assist us in meeting other needs for these families this Christmas!

How do I participate?

- 1. Choose Angels or Snowflakes from the tree
- 2. Purchase the item written on the Angel or Snowflake
- **3.** Wrap the gift, and <u>attach the Angel/Snowflake you chose to the gift</u> so that we know which item the gift contains.
- 4. Please tie the angel/snowflake to the gift so that it is easily removed without damaging the packaging
- 5. Return the gift to the Fellowship Hall and place in the designated area <u>NO LATER THAN</u> <u>SUNDAY, DECEMBER 15th.</u>

Your generosity to Bethany enables us to continue the mission and ministry of this great church. We are grateful that we can build upon a strong foundation as we move into a bright tomorrow!




